

## **Curriculum Organisation**

All National Curriculum Subjects are taught to all ages, Mathematics, English and Science being Core Subjects and History, Geography, ICT, Technology, P.E., Music and Art foundation subjects. The whole curriculum is organised to promote the development of skills, concepts, knowledge and attitudes.

Pupils in the Reception Class are working in the Foundation Stage, Year 1 and Year 2 are working at Key Stage 1 of the National Curriculum. Those in Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 at Key Stage 2. Towards the end of Year 2 and Year 6, pupils are assessed using National Standard Assessment Tests.

### **Mathematics:**

Number, Algebra, Measurement, Shape, Space and Data Handling

Applying skills learnt to practical solutions. Knowing which skill to use to find the solution.

### **English:**

Listening, Speaking, Reading, Writing and Spelling. At Key Stage 1 we use the Wise Owls Phonics scheme.

Communication of meaning in all written and spoken forms which enable the pupils to be clearly understood.

### **Science:**

Exploration and Discovery

Through guided observation, discussion and testing to understand scientific principles.

### **Technology:**

Design and Information Communication

Solving a problem by designing, evaluating and making the design. Using computers to assist learning and as a work tool for organising, storing and retrieving material.

### **Humanities:**

Geography and History

From their everyday surroundings and the here and now to the wider area and comparisons and reasons for change over time.

### **Physical Education:**

Games, Movement, Swimming and Gymnastics

Not only the development of physical skills but also safe practice, coping with success and failure through good sporting behaviour and fair play.

### **Creative Arts:**

Music and Art

Developing skills and experiencing the works of others through a variety of music methods and materials.
